Provincial Hosting & League 1 Women's Interprovincial Championships

We are extremely excited to be hosting a major soccer event coming in August this year. In conjunction with Alberta Soccer, we will be hosting the 2025 League1 Women's Interprovincial Championships in conjunction with the Alberta Provincial Championships for Tier 2 and Tier 3 teams. This event will be held August 8 to 10 with League1 games scheduled for Friday and Sunday at Emerald Hills Regional Park. Provincial games will be played at the Millennium Place and Strathcona Athletic Park fields, with the likely possibility for some other fields to see use. Alberta Soccer is planning for quite a celebration with events and festivities at all three venues. Will be reaching out for volunteer support to make this event a success. Thank you in advance to those that come out to help. This event will boost the local economy through filling the hotels and restaurants and bringing national attention to our fantastic facilities here in Strathcona County. We hope to see all of you come out to enjoy the event and celebrate our community.

National Youth Soccer License

On Friday, June 13 we received a response to our NYSL application submitted April 15 from Canada Soccer, and we are pleased to share that we are moving on to the next steps in the certification process. The application process was intense, and an immense amount of work went into providing the documents, policies and processes to satisfy the 180+ action items required in the Canada Soccer portal.

The next steps involve completing the remaining action items in progress, Alberta Player Development League readiness discussions with Alberta Soccer for a league entry in the fall of 2026 and updating staffing structure and finances.

We remain committed to the evaluation of participation in the NYSL and APDL in the best interests of the players of Phoenix FC and the health of the club and association.

It is our understanding that currently there are no other clubs progressing to the next steps of the application process for the 2026 intake window.

Phoenix FC Technical Director

It is with a sad heart that we are saying farewell to our Technical Director Bart Choufour. Bart has been instrumental in the implementation of the philosophies and values of our club and has helped build a truly player development focussed program. Bart will be helping us in the transition of his role and continuing in his current role until the end of July.

With this brings exiting opportunity for the club. Bernie Soto has been extremely successful in his role as Executive Director and the board has immense confidence in Bernie's leadership of this club as we move forward. We are using the opportunity to support Bernie in evaluating the current staffing structure and ensure we have dedicated support for the success of each player and program here at Phoenix FC.

We have begun the process of discovering a new Technical Director and look forward to finding the right person for the role. We look forward to providing more updates in the coming weeks.

Finances

The recent news showing the financial strains on some of the clubs in our community have reiterated the importance of strict fiscal responsibility required to successfully

manage our association and club. I am happy to report we continue to see improvement in the financial reporting and the trend remains positive toward achieving our budget and financial goals for 2024-2025.

Facility Updates

We have been in communication with Strathcona County regarding the Indoor Field House project and we are happy to report the plan for 2025 is on schedule, with the final phases of planning and development and contractor selection, with the construction remaining on schedule to start in the spring of 2026. This premier indoor facility will be an amazing facility to support our indoor soccer programming and will likely draw in the opportunity to see major events such as League1 and national team training and events. This facility has been the vision of this club and its membership for a long time, and we are thrilled at the prospect of seeing shovels go into the ground next spring.

We are extremely fortunate to have such a strong partnership with Strathcona County, who shares our ideals that proper facility and maintenance support are vital to support the youth athletes in our community. When we travel to other municipalities we are often reminded of how fortunate we are to have the facilities and spaces we do.
